



### ENRICHMENT FOR SQUIRRELS

As young squirrels grow, it is important to offer some nutrition and entertainment from the outside. Be careful and make sure nothing has been sprayed by chemicals. Here is a list of items that can be used:

Corn husks and cobs	Edible flowers (carnations,
(raw)	chrysanthemums, hibiscus, wild rose
Deer antlers or sterile bones to wear down teeth	hips)  Offer variety of smells from spices or extracts on a stick
"Forced" tree cuttings in winter	Cut food up in larger or smaller pieces,
"Short" roll of toilet paper to shred	or smear on sticks Hammock
Paper towel tube with nut inside	Hide treat inside another food
Toilet paper tube with food or treat inside	Real hollow logs (if you can find them!)
(fold ends shut)	PVC tunnels (T -or L-shaped)
Braided fleece rope hung from top of cage	Nesting materials for stuffing a nest box:
Cardboard boxes	leaves, grasses, pine straw, live twigs with leaves attached, moss, red cedar
Cardboard tubes (incl. oatmeal tubs) for	bark strips, fleece strips
tunnels	Tray of dirt, clay, even snow!
Open window for nature sounds	Old purse with handles/straps that allow it to hang from top of cage. (Watch out for any fraying.)

### OUTDOOR CAGE AND RELEASE

When the squirrels are approximately 10-12 weeks old, weigh at least 250 grams, have tails that are thick and bushy, sleek coats, and teeth that are aligned properly, they are ready for a release cage. The youngsters should be moved to their outside cage while they are contained in their nest box. If they are not already using a nest box made of wood, they should be supplied with one at this point. You can stuff the outside nest box with wheat straw for bedding (never do this in an indoor nest box.)


